Positive Behaviours for Learning

Be in the Right Place at the Right Time

This week our focus falls under the school rule, Respect for Self and Others. "Do to others as you would have them do to you: for this is the law and the prophets" (Mt 7:12)

The purpose of this rule is to reinforce the need to be in the right place at the right time to ensure our safety and the safety of others.

The students speak at length in their classrooms about;

- ✤ When they are in the right place at the right time, they are being responsible.
- Out of bounds areas and why an area may be classed as 'out of bounds'.

+ Being at the right place when the bell rings. Where is the right place to be when the bell rings; in the morning, after recess, after lunch, after school?

+ How to speak and act with kindness when reminding others about an out of bounds area.

Procedure: When you see the prompt or hear the signal -

- Stop what you are doing
- Remind others
- Move in an orderly manner to the right place,

This attitude can extend to the home by encouraging children to take responsibility to ensure they are ready to leave for school on time. This can be achieved by having all school belongings packed by a set time and then ensuring everyone is ready to leave home at a certain time. Taking responsibility for our belongings and actions can only be positive steps towards being in the right place at the right time. Michael Grose, (Parenting Ideas) suggests that a morning routine displayed in pictures or photographs (maximum of 5 activities), helps kids to sequence activities. Below I have included a checklist that you could use to help with the morning routine – *remember these names may be different for each class*. 
