#### Parent/Teacher Interviews

My thanks to all those parents who have taken the time to meet with teachers this week and next. The teachers have appreciated the opportunity to discuss some of the areas they will be focussing on with your children. We very much value the partnership we have between the home and school.

#### P&F Meeting

My thanks to our new P&F Executive who presented reports at our first P&F Meeting for the year last Tuesday. We have lots of plans for 2017. At this meeting I presented the data gathered from 127 families who completed the MMG Survey in November/December last year. It was quite a long presentation but I felt it was important to acknowledge all the areas that had been surveyed. I thank those at the meeting for their reflections and discussion. We have many things to be pleased about and I include a summary of four pages that was given to me from those who conducted the survey.

One suggestion from the group on Tuesday evening was to include the names of those who are receiving merit cards in the newsletter each week. This gives parents the opportunity to attend that particular assembly if they are able. The Thursday newsletter will list those who are receiving an award at the following Monday assembly. This will start in next weeks newsletter.

#### Homework

There were many different opinions about homework in the survey, some wanting less, some wanting none, some wanting more. Homework is one of the most discussed areas when I meet with parents each year. As a staff we have been discussing ideas around this area and some of the challenges.

I decided to have three weeks without homework to start the year calmly. I recall this happening at my sons' high school and it was wonderful giving them a chance to transition into new classes, new teachers, new expectations etc. Apologies for the confusion that that caused some people but I think the reflection time has been beneficial.

We want homework activities to be relevant, useful and fostering good habits while developing a love of learning. We want to encourage much more reading in the home environment, fiction texts, non-fiction, poetry and multi-media resources (eg websites, videos etc). Each year the students have the opportunity to take part in the Premier's Reading Challenge with books chosen to suit their level of understanding and interest. We have them all in our well-stocked library. We would love to have many more students be part of this initiative and we will be encouraging that even more so this year.

In Kindergarten to Year 4 the focus of home learning will be around Reading, Maths activities and word study. Every two weeks the teachers will update their grade weebly pages so that families are aware of learning focus areas for the next fortnight. Teachers have explained the process to parents this week and we will advise when the next update happens.

Our students in Year 5 and 6 will undertake more formal aspects of homework but through these tasks we will be encouraging the students to gather, organise and reflect on information that will help them in their collaboration and problem-solving back in the classroom.

We will continue the discussion around home learning and will welcome feedback as this semester unfolds.

### **Library News**


#### Library Borrowing Days

Every week all children have the opportunity to borrow from our school library either with me or with their class teachers. Each child should have a library bag in which to keep their books. This helps to protect the books from food and drinks which may be in a school bag. If borrowed books are kept in this bag when not being read it makes life a little easier when it is time to return books to school (no more searching for books under the bed or in the family bookshelf!!!)

This year Kindergarten and Year 2 students borrow on Mondays, Year 1 students borrow on Thursdays (but can return their books on Wednesdays) and Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 students borrow on Fridays.

### Premier's Reading Challenge

We will be participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge at OLOR again this year. Attempting the PRC encourages children to read (or to be read to), to select a variety of books to read and to keep an online record of what they have read.

The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. (see PRC Website)

Students who complete the Challenge will be recognised for their efforts with a certificate at the end of the school year. Permission notes for Kindergarten, new students in other classes and other students who have never participated in the Challenge will be sent home next week. Students who have participated in the PRC in previous years do not need to complete a permission note. Their username and password will remain the same. online, registration is complete. For those students who are new to the Challenge (including Kindergarten students), usernames and passwords will be sent home over the next few weeks once they have been registered.

The 2017 Challenge kicks off on Monday 6 March and closes on Friday 25 August.



### School Photography Guidelines for Parents and Carers

### Information for Schools

Parents and carers have long enjoyed photographing their children's progress at school. Today this often includes sharing the images on social media. When other students in the background are identifiable, there can be concerns if their parents/carers have not given permission and the images become public. Some parents and carers may have general privacy concerns about images of their children being posted without their consent, or in some cases, there can be real legal or safety concerns for the child or family concerned.

The attached School Photography Guidelines for Parents and Carers are intended to set out best practice in this evolving policy area.

### School privacy obligations

Schools operating under the Privacy Act must obtain consent from parents/carers and students before photographing or recording images of students for online use. Schools with knowledge of personal information concerning students who cannot be identified publicly for legal or other reasons generally may not disclose such information.

### General position regarding personal photography by parents/carers

The Privacy Act does not regulate personal photography or recordings by parents/carers. Schools are generally not in a position to control the personal photography activities of parents/carers or to proactively monitor what they post on social media. Generally, there is no right of schools to prevent photography in public outside the school grounds, unless a stalking, harassment or other legal issue arises.

### What schools can do

Discussion of respectful and safe photography practices under these model Guidelines can be integrated as part of school community educational programs.

Additionally, where a school considers it appropriate, it may restrict photography on school premises or excursions by setting conditions of entry. Where such restrictions are used they should be clear, tailored, publicised and capable of enforcement.

For example, on the swimming carnival note a school may state that "no photography or recording is permitted at this excursion as required by pool rules and under our school policy". This would be an example of a policy which is likely to be supported by most parents/carers and capable of enforcement. A parent/carer who wilfully disregards this policy could be warned and if persisting, could be required to leave the venue.

If a school receives a complaint from a parent concerning the photography or social media activity of another parent/carer, the school should follow its complaints handling procedure. In more extreme cases the school may assist the complainant to refer the matter to relevant authorities such as the Office of the eSafety Commissioner, or may be required to refer the matter to law enforcement authorities. In the case of persistent behaviour the school may be able to take action under its enrolment conditions.
