

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REFLECTIONS

Easter and the Resurrection

Easter is the season of mystagogical catechesis, that instruction that unpacks the hidden mystery of the experience of the sacraments of initiation received or renewed at Easter. The readings of each Sunday concentrate on some aspect of this mystery. The central theme of this Sunday is newness of life in Christ. This newness is not without its historical context. It burst forth first in the resurrection of Christ, and then through the preaching of the first Christians.

This week we all had opportunity to celebrate in renewed life with Jesus. Over the weekend in all churches, Christians renewed their faiths through word, song and action. As a school community, we were blessed with a very joyous liturgy co-ordinated and dramatised by our Year 3 students for the Resurrection. Father Robert reminded each and every one of us about the importance of the Easter Season ahead. It is through the visible reminders of our Paschal candle lit in the Cathedral for the next 50 days that we are both in celebration and memory of Jesus' resurrection. The five nails in the candle are significant reminders of the nails which Jesus bore, through suffering and hardship. It is also interesting to note that incense is placed in each of the nails within the candle as another reminder of the aromatic spices which were used to prepare Christ's body for the tomb.

Anzac Day

Next Friday we will be celebrating Anzac Day through a Liturgy to be held at 2pm. We will mark this significant day next week as it falls over the student holiday break. You are all invited to join us as a school community to celebrate and remember those who have gone before us in war, serving for our country.

In the front seat unless all middle row seats are taken by younger children, in restraints Out of a booster unless the child has physically outgrown their booster seat-unusual.

Booster do's and don'ts

RMS, NRMA and KIDSAFE all recommend boosting your child until they are 145cms tall

(Most kids would be 10-12 yrs old)

*The reason is that cars are built for adult size bodies. Studies show that more than half of the children aged 8-12 killed in car crashes have the seatbelt under their arm or behind their back. This is because they do not fit the car.

It is also STRONGLY RECOMMENDED that children under 12 avoid the front seat if there are airbags present.
